As a longtime friend of the owner, architect Ken Richmond is well acquainted with her affinity for old Northern Michigan cottages—a look he parlayed perfectly into the renovation of this former drab downtown Traverse City home. Find quintessential Up North resort-architecture touches including white clapboard siding, a bounty of beadboard on the walls and ceilings, a hodgepodge of new and old maple and oak floors, painted brick and an intimate relationship between interior and exterior spaces. The efficient, galley kitchen is outfitted with counters spacious enough to handle the owner's pie-making hobby; the handsome black fire-slate countertops can take any abuse her rolling pin dishes out. The focal point in this home just may be the exaggerated bay window covered in Middle Eastern-inspired pillows made for cozying up with the evening's last bottles of wine—an exotic twist on Up North comfy. — E.E.
